3. Why do you collect information about me?

We handle inquiries, requests and complaints received via e-mail, Website or social networks. For this reason, we need to collect, use and store information about you.

4. What information do you collect, use and store about me?

- Identification data (name, surname, company, etc.);
- contact details (e-mail address, etc.);
- additional data required (if a request is made for logistics services – loading address, date of dispatch, unloading address, etc.);
- any other information you submit on your initiative that you consider relevant in the context of the inquiry or offer you make.

5. What information should I provide to you and why?

When making a request, you may be asked to provide additional information about you so that we can handle your inquiry properly.

6. What is the legal basis for collecting information about me?

We collect information about you legally because:

- We have a legal obligation to keep the inquiries, requests and complaints received (Article 6 (1) (c) of the GDPR).

7. Do you collect sensitive information about me?

Please do not provide us with information about your racial or ethnic origin, political opinions, religious or philosophical beliefs, trade union membership, health, sexual orientation, as well as genetic and biometric data (including photos and fingerprints).

If we receive, use it or protect sensitive information about you, you will be deemed to have given us the consent by providing us with such information.

8. Do you make automatic decision making or profiling based on information about me?

9. Do you share my information with other entities?
